We would first like to thank everyone for all of the help that you have given the Sisters in Eutaw and us over the years with the Angel Tree. Because of your kindness, you have helped many families have a very happy Christmas.

We started our Angel Tree project this past weekend. We are working again with the Sisters in Greene County to help them give the needy of this county a happy Christmas. This year, the Sisters have sent us 11 families which equals about 44 people. The ages range from newborn to around 80 years old. The Sisters have the families put their greatest need on the form that they fill out for us. The needs can be anywhere from diapers for the babies, clothing, sheets, blankets, etc. We do have toys on there for the younger ones. To them that is their greatest need, not the clothing or the school supplies.

The Angels on the tree come in several different colors: blue for infants, red for girls, green for boys, and white for adults and family items.

Please keep in mind that this may be the only Christmas these people will have. Please make sure to return your family gift, wrapped with the angel attached, no later than the weekend of November 24th and November 25th

We are also asking each family of the Parish Community to bring a non-perishable food item now through the weekend of November 24th and November 25th. These food items will help the Sisters to restock their food pantry that they run year-around.

We will be holding a clothing and coat drive again this year. If you have any gently used clothing (baby, children, adults), the Sisters would love to have them. There will be a box in the Narthex where you can place them.

As always, we would like for you to attach your angel to the gift that you purchased and place it under the tree. All family gifts (blue, red, green, & white angels) need to be wrapped. You can bring the angels back until the weekend of November 24th and November 25th.
