Sunday February 2nd, 2025 **Presentation of the Lord Feast**

Luke 2:22-40 Father Reju Pynadath J.

Today we celebrate the feast of the presentation of the Lord in the Temple. Two things are happening in today's Gospel: purification of the mother and presentation of the first born.

Presentation of the first born to the Lord reminds the parents that they don't own any child. God is the owner of any child. Children are given to us in trust for a time, by God. They are entrusted to the parents, to the teachers and to the community so that we all may educate them. Education is a process whereby we help the student to discover his own capacities and abilities that may be dormant in him. Presentation of the Lord reminds us that we all are custodians of God's children and we are responsible for their self discovery.

Luke says the parents came to the temple for their purification. Actually it is the purification of mother after giving birth. This purification has nothing to do with sin. Giving birth is a sharing activity in the works of creation of God. As a mother delivers a child she becomes one with the Creator God. Therefore in childbearing and giving birth, mother becomes one with the divine. After giving birth she returns to normal secular life. She has to end her oneness with the divine. This is one way of looking at the purification of the mother after giving birth to her child.

The prophet Simeon and prophetess Anna teach us that God has a plan for everyone of us and it's fulfillment demands patient waiting. Everything happens at God's time and not at our time nor as we want them to be. Patient waiting for God's time should be backed up with constant prayer. Prayer gives us hope.

So, today's feast of presentation of the Lord in the temple reminds us of our own responsibilities for others. We have to submit ourselves to the plan of God which would be fulfilled at God's on time. God would purify us that we may live a holy life on Earth.

God bless you all, Amen.

Candlemas Day, or the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, is celebrated each year on the second of February, exactly forty days after Christmas. The name Candlemas comes to us from England and refers to the custom of blessing and distributing candles in procession before the celebration of Holy Mass. When this feast was later adopted in the Western church, the growing devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary led it to be regarded as a day in her honor rather than that of Christ, her Son; it was called the "Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary" in commemoration of the days of her purification, forty days after the birth of her Son, as required by Jewish law as found in chapter 13 of the Book of Leviticus. The women of Israel were considered to have contracted a legal stain in childbirth, and it was for this reason that they were obliged to offer a young pigeon or dove as a sin offering. By this sacrifice, they were free once more to attend ceremonies of worship.
