Sunday February 9th, 2025 "Here I Am. Send Me!"

Luke 5:1-11 Father Reju Pynadath J.

In today's first reading we have the details of the call of prophet Isaiah. At the presence of the Divine, Isaiah acknowledges his unworthiness. He confesses that he is a man of unclean lips and living among a people of unclean lips. But the Lord, not counting his merits, removes his wickedness and purges his sin. Then Isaiah says "Here I am send me!"

In the second reading we have the confession of Paul. He confesses that he persecuted the Church of God and is not fit to be called an Apostle. And then we have the very famous statement from St Paul: "By the grace of God I am what I am."

In the gospel of the day we have Peter confessing his own unworthiness. He says "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." But Jesus strengthens him saying "Do not be afraid;" and he follows Jesus.

In all these three incidents the common pattern is that God does not count the merits of the human person; the human person is confessing his unworthiness; God strengthens the human and the human person follows the Lord.

Through baptism we are called by God not because we had any merits. We need to be aware of and confessing our unworthiness. It is the grace of God that has made us His ministers.

Jesus called Paul, Peter and other apostles during their daily life routines. They were not highly spiritual people spending time in the synagogue! They were called to be active ministers and not to be cloistered. We have to be very vigilant to discern the call of God during our daily life routines. We have to be proud of our unworthiness and corresponding, strengthening grace of God.

Trusting on God's grace we have to be able to respond to the One who is calling us "Here I am, Lord, send me!"

God may guide you all, Amen.
