GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: LUKE 21:25-28b, 34-46 ♦ THE ADVENT SUNDAY ♦

- We are entering into a new year. From today the liturgical calendar of the Catholic Church begins the "Year of Grace 2022; Year C." So let us all welcome this Year of Grace 2022 with more hope and faith. Liturgical new year starts with the season of Advent. The Latin word "Advent" means 'coming,' and so through these four weeks of prayer and penance, we prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ Jesus.
- As the tradition goes, the four weekends prior to Nativity form the Advent season. We light up four different candles on all these weekends. First Sunday (i.e., today) it is called the "Prophet's Candle" and it represents the virtue of 'hope.' Next Sunday it is called "Bethlehem Candle" and represents the virtue of 'faith or love.' The third Sunday it is called the "Shepherd's Candle" and represents the virtue of 'joy.' Only on this third Sunday we light up 'pink' candle. Now the last/fourth Sunday it is called "Angel's Candle" and it represents the virtue of 'peace.' Hope, Faith (love); Joy and Peace are the virtues that Jesus brought in to earth on Christmas. Those are the Christmas gifts from Jesus Christ.
- We are in the First Sunday of Advent. Today we light up the Prophet's Candle which is purple in color. Purple is the royal color and it represents kingship. So it reminds us that the King of the Universe is coming.
- Purple is also the color representing repentance, penance, and ardent prayer. So from today on, we are preparing ourselves to welcome the real king of the universe to our own lives. The means of this preparation are repentance, penance, and prayer.
- We call it Prophet's Candle. And in today's first reading we hear the prophecy of the prophet Jeremiah about the king who is going to come as the fulfillment of all the prophecies and expectations. This week we meditate on the prophets and their prophecies predicting the coming of the Messiah.

■ The virtue we meditate today is hope. The Old Testament people and prophets expected the coming of Christ. The nativity of Christ gives hope to the world. It provides the world with a new light. Let us be more hopeful in life. There is no reason we should be desperate. If you are a Christian you should be an optimist and never pessimistic in life. We should be able to see the positive sides of all life experiences.

The Advent Wreath

- The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us—a love that sent His Son into the world to redeem us from the clutches of sin. It also represents Eternal Life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ. The Advent wreath traditionally holds four candles which are lit, one at a time on each of four Sundays. Each candle represents 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the world's Savior—from Adam and Eve to Jesus Christ. Some Advent wreath traditions include a fifth white candle, namely the "Christ Candle," representing the virtue of 'purity,' that is lit on Christmas Eve.
- Let us have hope in life. Hope for Christ. Be bold enough to hope like the Old Testament people. Be hopeful of eternal life. Babe Jesus bless you all.
